

Graves County Public Library COVID-19 Closure Plan Revised

As you know, the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has reached the United States. In accordance with the Kentucky governor's mandate effective Thursday, March 26th at 8 pm, **The Graves County Public Library will discontinue curbside service and stay closed to the public until it is deemed safe to reopen. (Decisions will be based on changes made through the CDC and State of KY).** It is our hope that by limiting close contact we will do our part to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

Effective Friday, March 27, 2020:

- All library programs scheduled for March 30-April 30, 2020 are cancelled.
- All meeting room reservations scheduled from March 30-March April 30, 2020 are cancelled.
- The book drop will be locked for returns.
- A limited number of staff will work in the building during the closure to answer phone calls, and perform other tasks.
- During the closure patrons can receive reference service and support with accessing digital resources by calling the Library at 270-270-2911 ext. 1 between the hours of 9 am and 5 pm Monday – Friday.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. To make things easier we are implementing some temporary policy changes:

- No overdue fees will accrue during our closure. You may keep any materials you have checked out until the library re-opens.
